## Logline

The nine year-old Shahrokh born a boy, wants his family and friens to recognize him as a girl and to help him/her to adjust to his/her new identity.

# **Short Synopsis**

The nine year-old effeminate boy, Shahrokh, humiliated and pushed away by his family and friends makes up his mind to adjust himself to his new identity and comes out to the people of his village. Having been through a variety of ordeal, Shahrokh, dressed in girl's clothes, shows up in the class before his classmates.



## **Full Synopsis**

Shahrokh sits in the classroom, scraping off his nail polish anxiously. The Villagers complain the Teacher, calling Shahrokh a wicked boy, who must be kicked out of the school for his effeminacy and the bad effect he may produce on other students. The Teacher asks Shahrokh not to come to school for a few days until he comes up with a solution. In the night, Shahrock's father asks his son to show him his hands and flips out when he sees one of Shahrokh's hands with painted nails; because the guests are to come to their house to ask for Shahrokh sister's hand and father thinks Shahrokh brings shame on him by his behavior.

Shahrokh's mother asks him not to show up before the guests and spend the night in his aunt's house. Shahrokh leaves the house in the rainy night, heads to a barn to talk to his girl best friend, Ghazal, and gives her a nail polish. Ghazal asks Shahrokh to go since her father strictly forbade her from talking to him.

Shahrokh goes to his aunt's house, but when he arrives there, hesitates for a while, changes his mind, and decides not to get in. Shahrokh goes to the school instead and spends the night in the classroom.

The next morning, Shahrokh awakes to the voice of children playing in the school yard and goes to play with them. The school boys, influenced by their parents, begin to humiliate and beat Shahrokh up. The Teacher comes and separates them. Shahrokh, whose clothes have been tattered, escapes the school.


Shahrokh runs around the village alleys, spotting a pretty dress hanged on the rope through the crack in the wall. Shahrokh runs off with the dress to the village pound, washes his face and hands, and changes his clothes.

The Teacher is dictating letters to the students in the class when Shahrokh, dressed in girl's clothes, comes in. The students laugh at him, but the Teacher defends him.

Shahrokh asks the Teacher to sit next to the girls. The Teacher gives him a thump up and continues dictating letters to the student.














#### **Director's Statement**



Whether this amount of violence is a product of the collective mind of a sick person persistently trying to ignore the truth? Whether this amount of verbal and physical abuse is normal to happen to a human being for just having different sexual tendencies?; Where this amount of aggression and bias towards such a human being is rooted from? I believe that the world is built on awareness and I try, as much as possible, to align my steps in the path of reaching this goal.


